SUBJECT: MEDICAID COVERAGE FOR INDIVIDUALS IN JAIL

1 2 3	Whereas,	Medicaid coverage is suspended when an individual is placed in jail even for a short-term; and
4 5 6	Whereas,	County jails do not have the resources to continue current expensive medications for many inmates with chronic illnesses; and
7 8 9	Whereas,	Many jailed individuals are currently on TennCare and had been stable on medications provided by TennCare prior to their incarceration; and
10 11 12	Whereas,	Stopping or changing chronic medications can have deleterious effects for individuals being treated for serious chronic illnesses; and
13 14 15 16 17 18	Whereas,	A Center for Medicaid Services (CMS) 2024 Section 1115 Reentry Demonstration Opportunity Waiver allows participating states to have state Medicaid pay for 90 days coverage prior to release of incarcerated individuals. This would include coverage even if the individual is incarcerated for 90 days or less; and
19 20 21	Whereas,	18 states have already received this waiver allowing inmates to receive their regular chronic medications; Now, therefore be it
22 23 24 25	RESOLVED,	That the TMA advocate for Tennessee to apply for the CMS Section 1115 Reentry Demonstration Waiver to pay for chronic medications for TennCare individuals entering jail; and be it further
26 27 28	RESOLVED,	That TennCare coverage for all chronic medications be continued during the individual's time incarcerated to prevent adverse health effects from the termination of previously established and proven drug therapies.
